


Prayer Letter

Everyone enjoyed lunch together and then had a fun programme of circus skills, crafts and exploring events from Peter's life. Saturday evening was a free family BBQ with fantastic puppet ministry as 50 people heard the parables of the two house builders and the lost sheep. The weekend finished off with a family film showing of "King of Kings". So blessed to share the Bible with children and families, some of whom had not heard these stories before."

Disciples Making Disciples | Equip Pupil Leader Training | September 2025

For the second year in a row, Karen Stangoe; Regional worker for Lanarkshire and I ran a one day training event for senior secondary school aged pupils who had a desire to see an SU Group start in their school. The Equip Pupil Leader Training was a great day with 20 young people from all across the central belt attending and learning from Karen and I how to be equipped to serve on a SU Group team.



We covered a lot of sessions across the day and got the attendees to consider how they can serve their school by running effective SU Groups. We studied Jesus example of being a servant leader from John's Gospel as well as looking at what kind of leader they are. We also looked at the importance of safeguarding and effective publicity for advertising SU Groups in their schools. It was a great time of learning and friendship making for the senior pupils who gave up the best part of their Saturday.
